Town of Newington

The Town of Newington is seeking to engage a Consulting Engineering firm to provide engineering services for the preparation of contract plans and documents for the following transportation project:

Pavement Rehabilitation of Kelsey Street and Christian Lane

The Consulting Engineer may also be required to provide surveys, prepare environmental documents and perform construction inspection. The construction cost is expected to be in the range of \$753,000, based on current prices. The Consulting Engineer will be evaluated and selected based on design and technical competence, the capacity and capability to perform the work within the time allotted, past record of performance, and knowledge of Federal, State and Town procedures, appropriately weighted in descending order of importance. The design fee will be negotiated on a Lump Sum basis. The construction inspection fee will be negotiated on a cost-plus basis. Firms responding to this request should be of adequate size and sufficiently staffed to perform the assignment described above.

The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) subconsultant goal will be no less than 0 percent of the agreement value. The selected firm must meet all Town, State and Federal affirmative action and equal employment opportunity practices. A letter of interest, together with general information on the firm and proposed subconsultants, the firm's brochure, current Federal GSA Form 330, experience of the firms, and a resume of key personnel should be addressed to: Town Manager, 131 Cedar Street, Newington, CT 06111. Additionally, all interested firms must submit a detailed statement including the organizational structure under which the firm proposes to conduct business. Proposed subconsultants should be clearly identified. The relationship to any "parent" firm or subsidiary firm, with any of the parties concerned, must be clearly defined.

Personnel in responsible charge of the project will be required to possess and maintain a valid Connecticut Professional Engineer's License. All letters of interest must be postmarked by a U.S. Post Office (if mailed) or in receipt by the Town Manager's office (if hand delivered), no later than 4:30 p.m. on February 22, 2008. Responses received or postmarked after this date will not be considered. All responses must be submitted in accordance with Town specifications, which are available in the Town Manager's Office. The Town reserves the right to reject any or all responses and proposals.
